



Position: School Water Stewards

Organization: Nanaimo & Area Land Trust

Location: Nanaimo, British Columbia

Position Type: Full-time approx. (37.5 hrs/wk), Contract/Temporary, approx. 48 Weeks

Job Overview:

Team Participants will work with the Coordinator, an Advisory Committee and local experts to develop and deliver curriculum-based lessons on water stewardship in elementary school settings. Participants will utilize near school water bodies to connect the school population and catchment community to their watersheds. Participants will seek feedback from schools and community to refine and improve project delivery. Participants will also promote School Water Stewards at professional development day functions.

This is a full-time position, from November 30, 2020 – October 31, 2021.

Responsibilities and Duties:

- Working as a team with the Coordinator and Advisory Committee.
- Working with content and curriculum experts to design lessons and activities.
- Working with school administration and teachers to deliver lessons and activities.
- Seeking opportunities to include the school catchment community in water stewardship activities.
- Seeking feedback from schools and community to improve lesson development and delivery.
- Promoting School Water Stewards at school and district based professional development events.
- Maintaining a daily record of team activities.

Qualifications:

- Must be eligible for participation in a Job Creation Partnership funded project.
- Must have strong problem-solving, written and oral communication skills.
- Ability to work well in a team setting.
- Familiarity with computers an asset, although not required. Candidates should be able to learn new skills and new equipment quickly.
- An interest in outdoor education and other physical pursuits an asset.
- Must be willing to undergo a criminal record check. Employer will pay for the cost of obtaining a criminal record check.
- Valid Class 5 Driver's License is an asset.
