



What is a Community Land Trust?

A land trust is an organization that exists to protect land. It has the authority to set up conservation covenants that are registered on a land title in perpetuity, and to monitor enforcement of that document annually. A land trust may also raise funds to purchase environmentally important green spaces, and carry out stewardship programs that preserve and enhance the natural values of land.

A variety of lands, from suburban to wilderness may benefit from trust agreements and activities, including:

- *urban green spaces*
- *agricultural or forestry lands*
- *special habitat areas*
- *sensitive ecosystems*



Who Are We?

- We began as a small group who came together to form a community land trust organization because of mutual concerns about conserving the natural values of land in the area.
- The NALT Board, staff, members, volunteers and supporters now consist of hundreds of local residents, representing a diverse cross-section of people.

Some of NALT's Achievements

The Nanaimo & Area Land Trust (NALT) became a registered society and charity in 1995 and was granted the right to hold conservation covenants on property titles. Over the years, NALT has achieved the following:

- Thirteen conservation covenants, including a property in Errington, South Winchelsea Island, Coates Millstone and Elder Cedar Nature Sanctuary on Gabriola Island, Mount Benson Regional Park, two nature sanctuaries, Mt Trematon Park and Salish View on Lasqueti Island, a private gulf island, Siddoo Park and Rainbow Island in the Cowichan Valley and Yellowpoint Lodge lands.
- NALT assisted with fundraising for the purchase of South Winchelsea Island and the Nanaimo River property. We have also assisted with acquisition of a property on Buttertubs Marsh and in the negotiation and acquisition of the Moorecroft property.
- Beginning in 1997, in partnership with the City of Nanaimo and funded by Environment Canada, NALT carried out a 4-year watershed stewardship project, called PROJECT 2000.
- From 2001 to 2003, NALT carried out a business stewardship – focused mainly on automotive businesses in the Long Lake /Diver Lake /Beaver Creek watershed.
- NALT has carried out several watercourse restoration projects, and “ground-truthing” studies of sensitive ecosystems – including Linley Valley and Mount Benson. Reports are available on request.
- For several years, NALT carried out annual contract work for the Garry Oak Ecosystems Recovery Team to enhance habitat and raise community awareness for protection of the endangered Coastal Vesper Sparrow flock that nests at Cassidy Airport.
- From 2001 to 2003, NALT carried out a successful campaign to raise \$500,000 to purchase property in the Linley Valley for parkland. From 2006 to 2008, we completed a fundraising campaign to raise another \$500,000 – this time for a park on Mount Benson.

- *public education about the importance of land stewardship; and operation of a stewardship outreach centre 5 days a week*
- *conservation covenants on privately owned and public lands*
- *land acquisitions by donation or purchase*
- *voluntary stewardship actions to protect habitat*
- *partnerships with public sector, private sector and non-profit agencies – both locally and regionally*
